The frequency of cleaning for exterior glass surfaces may vary from two to four, or more cycle's per year.

**ARCHITECTURAL GLASS IN BOTH COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS REQUIRES A SIGNIFICANT INVESTMENT BY THE PROPERTY OWNER.** The long term integrity of the glass in door and window systems requires the adherence to a schedule of cleaning and maintenance. Often the questions arise: How often should the architectural glass at my property be cleaned and why?

This guestion is answered in the technical bulletin titled "The Systematic Cleaning and Restoration of Architectural Glass", (available at www.IWCA.org) authored by Dr. Paul F.
